
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Core Speaking Assessment Training

The Speaking Assessment Scoring Series on this page, as well as the Speaking quizzes (one for Grades 1-5 and another for 6-12), must be completed by all Test Administrators who will administer and score the ACCESS for ELLs Paper Speaking test. You must complete the quiz for all grade levels you will administer, so for some educators, both quizzes are required. District and state Test Coordinators will monitor Test Administrators' completion of these quizzes.

The purpose of the Speaking Assessment Module is to prepare educators to confidently and accurately rate students' speaking test performance through the scoring scale and scoring rules. You should plan to spend one to two hours to completing the Speaking Assessment Scoring Module (depending on number of grade-level cluster tests you will administer) and 15-20 minutes per quiz (this estimate does not include reviewing or rereading).

Quick Facts: Speaking

- Takes approximately 15 to 35 minutes per student. Higher grade-level clusters and tiers will take longer.
- Media-delivered. Equipment needed: CD player and speakers.
- Materials needed: Speaking Test Booklet, CD, Student Test Booklet, number 2 pencil.
- Test administration should take place in a quiet room free of distractions.
- Virtual Test Administrator, Ms. Lee, guides students and asks them sets of questions that are design to elicit language at progressively higher target proficiency levels.
- Model student, Nina, provides task level

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

- Test Administrator's Script.

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

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Scoring: Correct or Incorrect

How to Read the Script: Read aloud black and bold text

SAMPLE LISTENING TASK 1

CUE A

3-5 LA A2

Point to UMBRELLA AT TOP. This is an umbrella. Point to UMBRELLA. Umbrella. Point to BOOTS. Boots. Point to T-SHIRT. T-shirt.

Sweep across UMBRELLA, BOOTS, T-SHIRT. Which one is an umbrella? PAUSE.

If correct, go to MOVING ON box.

If incorrect or no response, repeat CUE A. After repeat, if incorrect or no response, go to CUE B.

Ending the Listening Section

End the section if the last task (Task 9) is administered.

OR

End the section if it is the third consecutive task that is marked Incorrect/No Response for the student.
