SUBJECT: **Hawaii Statewide Assessment Program (HSAP) Training**

The annual Hawaii Statewide Assessment Program (HSAP) training will be held at various locations throughout the state in September 2019. Public and public charter school personnel who have a role in coordinating HSAP test administration and/or making decisions based upon the results of these assessments should attend this training.

The purpose of the HSAP training is to provide participants with the necessary information to plan and administer statewide assessments so that the results can be used for school improvement and accountability purposes. Participants will learn about updates on policies and practices for proper administration of these assessments and will gain a deeper understanding of the appropriate use of the results. Presenters will emphasize the effective use of summative and formative assessments results in order to improve student achievement and to ensure equity.

Breakout sessions for the HSAP training include the following topics:

- updates to Smarter Balanced test coordination, administration, and security
- developing assessments and instructional resources aligned to the Common Core
- understanding and interpreting Smarter Balanced Assessment scores
- new HSA Science Assessments aligned to the Next Generation Science Standards
- accessibility and accommodations
- technology readiness and troubleshooting

- The ACT College and Career Readiness System of Assessments
- using data to guide school and student success

All school-level Assessment Team members are encouraged to attend the training. Members of a school's Assessment Team include the principal and/or vice principal, test coordinator(s), technology coordinator, curriculum coordinator, data coordinator, and student services coordinator. If a member of a school's Assessment Team is scheduled to provide direct instruction to students on the date of the training, the Assessment Section will provide a substitute for the teacher (reason 54, sub code: 15654571 for DOE schools or 18055571 for public charter schools). The last session of the day will be a work session for school Assessment Team members to meet and plan for the administration of statewide assessments at their school. In order to make the best use of this time, all school-level Assessment Team members should attend this training.

Complex areas are encouraged to have a team attend the training that includes the complex area superintendent, school renewal specialists, and complex area support team members involved with supporting test coordination and administration. If a complex area requests that additional staff members participate in the training, the additional staff members will be placed on a waiting list until the key complex area staff members have an opportunity to register.
